



## BOTM May 2023: Cubed Lattice (allpeoplequilt.com)

This block uses 4 fabrics (3 main and 1 background). For this block Tina and I decided to use purples and blues (if you feel another color will blend well with these please feel free to add it). We can't wait to see your cubed lattice.





### What you need:

1. 3 main fabrics a Dark, Medium, and Light in blues or purples (you may use different color if you feel it will blend well) and 1 background fabric
  - a. Fabric A: (4) 3 ½ inch squares
  - b. Fabric B: (2) 4 ¼ inch square for HST
  - c. Fabric C: (2) 4 ¼ inch square for HST
  - d. Background Fabric: (4) 4 ¼ inch square for HST

### How To Make:

1. To make your HST draw a line down the center of all your 4 ¼ inch background fabrics. Once a line is drawn, lay (2) background fabrics on top of (2) fabric B's, and lay (2) background fabrics on top of (2) fabric C's. Sew ¼ on both sides of your drawn line. Once you've sewn your ¼ inch on both sides, cut down the line, iron, and trim to 3 ½ inch square.
2. Once your HST is made you just need to lay your Squares and HST out in order to resemble our two samples above and sew together. You will end up with an unfinished 12 ½ inch Block.
  - a. This pattern provides another opportunity to use a HST ruler which can make trimming these blocks even easier or, since you will have 4 HST with your background and fabrics B & C you may choose to just cut (2) 5 ¾ inch squares from your background fabric and cut (1) 5 ¾ inch square from both fabric B & C. Sew a ¼ inch all the way around and cut diagonally across both sides, this will give you 4 HST that you need to iron and trim to 3 ½ inches. If you choose to do it this way it is good to starch your fabric since you will be working more on the bias.



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
